Today's Bible Story: Say Something (Jesus Heals 10 Men) • *Luke 17:11-19*

Today's Bottom Line: Say thank you.

Monthly Memory Verse: *Give thanks to the LORD, because he is good. His faithful love continues forever.* Psalm 136:1 (NIRV)

1. Happy Hopscotch

What You Need: Carpet Tape for Prepared hopscotch space (1 Roll per Campus)

What You Do:

- Invite kids to hop through the hopscotch board, placing one foot in each square as they go.
- Encourage them to count out loud as they hop.
- As kids improve at hopping through the board, encourage them to go faster.
- Challenge your group to see how fast they can go through the course as one big team.

What You Say:

“Great job everyone! That was a fun activity where we all got to work together as a team with one goal and focus. Today, let's always remember that we should go through life thanking God for all that He has done for us!”

2. High Five!

What You Need: Hand Activity Sheet (1 per kid), Markers (1 set per kid), pens (1 per kid)

What You Do:

- Give kids a Hand Activity Sheet, marker set, and a pen.
- Say “Give thanks to the LORD, because he is good. His faithful love continues forever. Psalm 136:1 (NIRV)” out loud together.
- Ask: What are some things you know you OUGHT to do?
- Help kids if they need suggestions.
 1. Help my family around the house
 2. Help kids who are younger than me
 3. Say kind, respectful words to my parents
 4. Choose shows and books that are good for me
 5. Show love all the time
 6. Work hard at school
 7. Pray for others when they need it
 8. Fix a problem when I see it
- Have Kids draw or write one thing they know they ought to do in each finger on the Hand activity sheet.
- Have Kids write “Give Thanks” on the palm of the hand, color their sheets, and share what they drew or wrote on their Hand activity sheet.

3. Gratitude Game

What You Need: One bag of colored gems with color code sticker (1 per kid)

What You Do:

- Give each kid a bag of gems.
- Instruct them to dump their gems in front of them and scramble them up.
- Taking turns, have each kid close their eyes, grab a gem and show it to you and everyone else.
 - Depending on what color gem they pick up, have them answer the color prompt on their Gratitude Game Sticker.
- Play as long as time and interest allow.
- Have the kids bring their bag of gems home to play with their family members.
